- OJizo Street -

Once upon a time, there was an Ojizo. He was fashionable, and he loved umbrellas. He was called "Umbrella Jizo". Today is a festival, the "Umbrella Festival" to celebrate him. Even without words, if you communicate with your heart and treat the jizo with hospitality, he will immediately smile and good fortune will come to you.

2 to 5 person 15 to 30 minutes from 10 years old

Before starting, select a difficulty level from */**/*** ★ * For details, see the placement rules on the back (other than the placement rules, the rest are the same).

I. Preparation (3 to 5 person)

The case of two people will be discussed later.

(1) Shuffle all cards except for the five Janome cards (see below) and place one face-down between each player (this is called the "Square"). Also, deal three cards to each player to keep as their hand, and the rest become a common deck.



2 Draw six cards face down from the deck and place them around the deck (this is called the "path").

3 Shuffle the deck, including the five Janome cards, and turn the top card of the deck face up (this is called the "Central Saugre").


4 Place the Ojizo card on one of the "path." The person who most recently held an umbrella becomes the starting player (Start P) and the festival begins.

About Ambrella cards

The center part of the umbrella card is called the head, and there are five different colors and three different ranks for the head.

Each player should have summary card to refer to.





2. Flow of the festival

Each player can choose one of the following three actions on their turn. Turns proceed clockwise, and one round is completed when everyone has had a turn.

"Play a Card":

Choose one card from your hand and place it face up on either side of your "square. When doing so, you must follow the placement rules described below, and cannot place it in a way that violates the placement rules.

"Pass a Card":

Choose one card from your hand and pass it to the player on your left or right (pass it face down so that no one else can see it).

"Take a Card": Choose a card from the "Central Square" (the top card of your deck), or a face-up card from the "Path" around your deck, and add it to your hand. If you take a card from the "Central Square." flip the top card of your deck face-up again. If you take a "Path" card, the card directly below the card in the "Central Square" (the second card from the top of the deck) is replenished face down to "Path." Note that each player's hand size is limited to four cards, and they cannot hold more Also, if a Janome Umbrella is face up on the "Path" or "central Square," it must be taken before any other card. *If there are multiple Janome Umbrellas, take them all. **★**Continued on the (5)


Example: If you perform "Take a card" in the following situations, take the ★ card first.



* Annotation:

Ojizo believes in communicating through the heart, not through words. While performing an action, players may not reveal information about their hand to other players, except to confirm the rules.

Up to six umbrella cards can be placed around each "Square." When placing cards, follow rules ① through ② below. If there are no cards that can be placed according to the rules below, you cannot "Place a Card."


- ① The head rank of the cards placed must go clockwise in the order "1, 2, 3, 1, 2, 3".
 ② Cards with the same head color cannot be placed next to each other.
- 3 There cannot be any cards with the same head color or head rank among the six cards.

When a turn is completed, move the Ojizo card on the "Path" one space clockwise, and turn the "Path" where the OJizo card was before face up. Then, begin the next round.



*The starting player will not change until the festival ends. So, each time the start player's turn returns, don't forget to move your Ojizo card. Follow the rules below depending on the difficulty level.

★: Cards with the same color and rank as a card in the central square cannot be played.
★★: Cards with the same color as a card in the central square cannot be played.

***: You cannot play a card that has the same head rank as a card in the central square. ***

***: You cannot play a card that has the same head color or head rank as a card in the central square.

During the festival, please place the following "Umbrella Rules" in a place where everyone can see them and refer to them as necessary.







- Umbrella Rules

 ① Keep "1,2,3,1,2,3"
- 2 The tops of adjacent umbrellas must be different colors
- 3 No Umbrellas with the same color and rank











3. The end of the festival

The festival ends when the following success conditions are met, and the results are evaluated based on the difficulty and number of players.

When six cards are placed around each "Square."

However, if any of the following failure conditions are met, the festival will immediately fail.

- ·When a player is unable to take any action.
 ·When moving an Ojizo card, when the path you want to move it to is not face down
- (it remains face up).
 •When you run out of cards in your deck.

Two-player rules

If two people are holding a festival, proceed as follows:

- *When placing the "Square" in Preparation (), place one in front of each player and one between each player, for a total of four.
- •When performing the action "Place a Card," each player can only place an umbrella card in the "Square" in front of them or to the left or right of them (they cannot place it in the "Square" in front of their opponent).

Other rules are the same as for 3-5 players.

FAQ

Q.Is there a list of cards? A.Please refer to the next page of this manual.

- Q. Can I communicate with my teammates by pointing or gesturing?
 A. There's no rule against not communicating verbally, but if you truly understand each other, you should communicate with your teammates through eye contact.
- Q. If the deck runs out of cards, can I continue to play until that round?
 A. The moment the deck runs out of cards, the festival ends (failure). Please be careful.
